**Year 3** Spring 2 - 2016

## **English**

- Focus on reading comprehension, sentence structure and use of vocabulary through reports and poetry.
- Daily opportunities to improve reading skills will be provided across the curriculum.
- Punctuation and sentence structure will be taught with a main focus recapping capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.
- Daily spelling activities focusing on keywords, spelling patterns. Also using spellings in own writing.

## Physical Education

- Swimming those that are going swimming must have their swimming kit in school every Wednesday.
- All children need their school P.E. kit in school.

# Science, History, Geography, Art, D&T and ICT

- Science Rocks describe, sort and compare rocks & their properties. Learn how fossils are formed n sedimentary rocks. Discover soil facts and consider different soil types. Create own fossil.
- Art/DT -Cave paintings, drawings inspired by the Stone Age to Iron Age.
- **ICT** research using internet. Create a presentation for class democracy.
- Humanities Geography Learn about types of settlement and land use, the resources that's people used. Locating countries on a map.

**History** - Learn about changes in Britain from Stone Age to the Iron Age. How people lived, homes, clothes, food, tools.

- Number- Adding and subtracting mentally and using a paper and pencil methods. Learn target multiplication and division tables.
- Measurement Measuring accurately in cm, mm. Measuring capacity in ml and litres.
   Measuring mass in grams and kilograms.
   Exploring analogue and digital time.
- Geometry Exploring and investigating 2D and 3D shapes. Finding the perimeters of 2D shapes.
