Year 4 Spring 2 - 2016

English

- Author study, Roald Dahl. On-going.
- Comparing two stories: The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe by C.S. Lewis and The Easter Story.
- Daily basic skills incorporating mental maths, spelling, punctuation and grammar activities.
- Explanation of science investigation.
- Give personal point of view on a text.
- Understand author voice and how dramatic conventions are used to create atmosphere.
- Write in paragraphs to organise ideas around a theme.
- Write with increasing legibility, consistency and fluency.

Physical Education

 Dance: to develop dance skills and evaluate own and others performance. Jive and lindy hop steps incorporated into motifs and sequences.

Science, History, Geography, Art, D&T and ICT

- Physical processes: Building electrical circuits.
 Changing components within a circuit to
 investigate the outcome. Presenting findings
 through a written explanation with photographic
 evidence of the practical task.
- History: Examining information about invaders and settlers the Angelo Saxons and Vikings. Recognising how knowledge of the past has helped to shape the present.
- Art: Exploring patterns from nature and the man-made world and interpreting them using different media.
- D&T: Design and make a Viking long boat or a long house. Finding suitable materials and evaluating their effectiveness to complete the task.
- Computing: E-mailing using child friendly Tocomail. Generating QR codes to provide display with links to videos of practical activities.

Mathematics

- Count backwards through zero to include negative numbers.
- Compare and order numbers beyond 1000.
- Compare and order numbers with up to two decimal places.
- Read Roman numerals to 100.
- Find 1000 more/less than a given number.
- Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000.
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for all tables to 12×12
- Recognise the place value of any four-digit number
- Read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12 and 24 hour clocks.

PSHCE and RE

- Christianity: The Easter Story. How is Peter important to Christians?
- Good to be me, healthy lifestyles.

French

- Je Mange... (I eat)
- Naming foods and drinks.
- Dual language story The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle.

Music
