

## Primary School PE and Sport Funding Policy

### Introduction

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per year for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in school.

This policy will outline the purpose of the funding and how the school will be held to account.

The allocation of spending will be included in a separate document, available alongside this policy.

At a later date the impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment as a result will be published in a separate document.

The school must spend the additional funding on improving our provision of PE and sport, but has the freedom to choose how to do this.

### Objectives

Our objectives are all focused on sustainable investment that will continue to develop and grow after the funding has ended.

- To improve the provision in PE and sport within the school's curriculum for Physical Education.
- To improve the quality of teaching and learning in PE and sport.
- To increase pupils' participation in PE and sport and to attend school sports competitions.
- To raise standards of achievement in PE and sport for all pupils.
- To make use of qualified expertise to support and promote the teaching of PE and sport.
- To provide places for pupils on after school sports clubs.

### Accountability

The school will be held to account over how the money is spent through a strengthened coverage of PE and sport within the Ofsted handbook.

Secondly one year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure of the funding and its impact.

Thirdly the school will include details of its provision of PE and Sport on the website alongside details of the broader curriculum, so that parents can compare provisions with other schools, both within and beyond the school day.

Finally the impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment will be published online January 2015.

### The Funding

The funding allocated to schools with 17 or more eligible pupils is £8000 plus £5 per eligible pupil.

Eligible pupils are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Reception, as recorded on January 2013 Census.

In the January 2013 Census 142 pupils were counted as eligible, meaning from September 2013 to September 2015 Roby Park was allocated £12,277.

### Allocation of funding

The spend outlined above has allowed us to meet certain aims set out in our School Development Plan:

As this has been our biggest investment, this is from where we have seen greatest impact. Membership of KSSP has brought several benefits, which have seen positive results throughout our school.

KSSP Specialist PE Teacher (Lord Derby Academy)

- 1 day per week support from a qualified PE specialist from Lord Derby Academy
- High quality curriculum PE, all children have had PE delivered from a specialist PE teacher in either dance, games or gymnastics.

- Children are having more opportunities to take part in team activities and increase their co-operation skills.
- PE specialist available for teachers to observe for their own professional development to enable delivery of higher quality curriculum PE.
- PE specialist to provide a wide variety of after school sports provision to meet the needs of pupils in Key Stages 1 and 2. This will further enhance the skills taught during the PE curriculum.

#### Restocking PE equipment and investing in Playground Equipment

- Children have access to high quality equipment to improve their skills in different areas.
- With better equipment the children are more physically active.
- Playtimes and lunch times are more structured; more positive behaviours are displayed from the children.
- Train Year 5 pupils to become Playground Sports Leaders to engage the younger children to take part in structured activities and exercise. This will also help to promote social interaction and behavior skills outside of the classroom.
- More fun at play time and lunch time!!
