Year 3 Summer 2- 2016

English

- Focus on reading comprehension, sentence structure and use of vocabulary through non-fiction and poetry.
- Daily opportunities to improve reading skills will be provided across the curriculum.
- Punctuation and sentence structure will be taught with a main focus recapping capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.
- Daily spelling activities focusing on keywords, spelling patterns. Also using spellings in own writing.

Physical Education

Science, History, Geography, Art, D&T and ICT

- Science -Plants looking into the structure of different plants and the functions of a plant.
- **Light and Shadows** Looking at what causes shadows and how shadows change throughout the day.

- ICT research using internet. Present work using different medias. Such as video.
- Humanities Geography Learn about types of settlement and land use, the resources that's people used. Locating countries on a map.

- Number- Adding and subtracting mentally and using a paper and pencil methods. Learn target multiplication and division tables. Revising equivalent fractions, ordering fractions and adding fractions to make a whole.
- Geometry Exploring and investigating 2D and 3D shapes. Finding the angles in 2D shapes. Recapping properties of shapes.
- Statistics Investigating and interpreting data. Looking at different ways to present findings.
