English

- Children are given daily opportunities to improve reading skills across the curriculum
- Daily Basic skills spelling, punctuation and grammar.
- Writing opportunities are created throughout the curriculum.
- Development of comprehension skills.
- Poetry using figurative language.
- Writing to create tension.
- Informal letter writing.

Physical Education

 Gymnastics will be delivered by an external sports coach. Children are given opportunities to practise and learn new skills every week.

Science, History, Geography, Art, D&T and ICT

• Science - Animals including humans
Children will build on their knowledge and
understanding of different systems within the body.
They will research the parts and functions of the
circulatory system.

DT - Printing

Designing and printing our own Christmas cards and wrapping paper.

• Computing - Young Author

During this project, children will develop a story idea in small groups to create a storyboard. The children will then use Book Creator and Brushes to create their own eBook including text, illustrations and audio.

• History - Crime & Punishment

Children will develop their chronological knowledge beyond 1066 through studying this aspect of social history. They will also deepen their historical awareness and understanding of how our past is constructed.

- Daily Basic skills.

- Calculating perimeter, area and volume of shape.

- Division writing remainder as a fraction.
