Next week, on Thursday 21^{st} May, we will be holding two discos for the children. 


Health and Safety Reminders:



As you are aware, the safeguarding of all of our pupils is of paramount importance to us. We have been made aware of some pupils and parents risking the safety of our children over the last few weeks so I would like to remind everyone of the rules around school:

- Dogs, regardless of how small they are, <u>are not</u> allowed on the school premises at anytime.
- Pupils and parents are asked to not ride their bikes around the school grounds as it can cause unnecessary accidents.





• We appreciate that due to large pupil numbers in our KS2 classes, we have a large volume of parents and pupils waiting at the bottom of the stairs at the start and end of the day. To help us manage a safe handover of the children, I would ask parents/carers not to crowd the stairs or the gate area. There is plenty of space to stand in the middle section of the path in front of the new extension so that you can be visible to staff. We now open the gate via the Foundation Stage Area to help improve the flow of traffic at the beginning and end of each day.

VE Day Celebrations:

Last week, Mrs Baxter led our whole school assembly discussing the reason for the VE Day celebrations. It was very important to share this historic British occasion with the children who enjoyed watching film clips of the WWII ending and the celebrations that followed.



Uniform/Equipment Reminder:

- School jumpers/cardigans can be purchased from the school office. Summer uniform may
 now be worn however school rules still apply with wearing black shoes/completely black
 trainers colourful pumps/trainers are not allowed to be worn for school.
- PE days in school are on Monday and Tuesday pupils should have a white t-shirt, black shorts and pumps/trainers in school on the day of their lesson. Year 1 have received information about what is required for swimming lessons.
- Reading books must be in school every day so that they can be changed or so a member of staff can listen to your child read.
- Homework is set on a weekly basis by class teachers however we are not always receiving full sets of completed homework back in. We ask that parents support us in making sure that homework is completed and returned on time.
