Safeguarding:

- Please make sure you provide the school office with up to date contact information e.g. telephone numbers. We have had cases where pupils have been ill and needed to go home however the contact numbers we have are no longer in use. **It is the responsibility of parents/carers to provide school with this information.**
- If your child is going to be absent from school, school policy is to contact the school office by 9am and inform us so we can record the correct information for your child. We are finding that some families are not calling us or writing a note in to school therefore their child receives an 'unauthorised mark'.
- Children who arrive late to school are being left to wander in alone by some parents/carers which is **unacceptable**. Children who arrive late to school must be taken to the school office and signed in with a reason provided for the lateness by an adult.



Uniform:

The majority of children are looking very smart in their school uniform at the beginning of the Summer Term. However, we have noticed that a small group of children are wearing bright colourful trainers rather than completely black shoes or trainers for school. Not all pupils have white t-shirts and black shorts for PE. School guidelines are very clear about this and we will be speaking to individual families next week about our concerns.
