Carnivores	Animals that eat meat.
Contemporary	Modern art, the art of today.
Etching	A printing process created by scratching lines onto a plate, applying ink and then paper.
Exoskeletons	Animals that have their skeletons on the outside.
Invertebrates	Animals without a backbone.
Land art	Art that is made directly into the ground using natural materials such as rocks or twigs.
Pattern	A repeated decorative design.
Sculpture	A 3D (solid) piece of artwork.
Sketch	A rough first drawing which helps you to plan your work.
Textile	Cloth or fabric.

A carnivore	is an animal that gets food from killing and eating other animals.
A herbivore	is an animal that only eats plants.
An omnivore	is an animal that eats plants and animals.
That camouflage means	animals and insects that can blend into their surroundings so they cannot be seen.
That recycled junk is	used paper, cardboard and plastic and tin which can be reused to make other things.
A motif	can be printed to repeat and look the same.
To make a design symmetrical	I need to make it exactly the same on both sides.
To work collaboratively means	to work in a group on the same piece of work.
A strut is	a structural support to strengthen something.
Bronze	is a strong, hard material.
Metallic means	a metal colour.
