END OF TERM

This half term finishes on Friday at 3pm and we reopen at 8.40am on Monday 24th February. Please make sure your child is ready on the playground for 8.40am as their learning starts promptly at 8.45am. If your child is not in class, they are not learning and they are missing out. Some children are coming into school at 8.50am which means they are missing out on 25 minutes per learning each week which equates to over 15 hours of lost learning over the period of a year.

VALENTINE'S DISCOS

On Thursday 13th February, we will be holding our Valentine's discos.

We will end the day, with our fabulous Valentine's discos with Nursery and Reception enjoying their party from 2.00-3.00pm during the school day. Y1 & Y2 will have their disco at 3-4pm with Y3 – Y6 having their disco 4.15 – 5.15pm.

All children can come to school in their party clothes. If children do not want to dress up, they can come to school in their uniform if they would prefer.

Nursery children who do not attend school in the afternoons but wish to come to the disco, can return to school at 2pm via the main office.

The cost of the disco for Nursery – Y2 children is £3.00 and includes a small packet of sweets, crisps and a drink. The cost of the disco for Y3 – Y6 is £3.00 and children get a chip cone and they can bring extra money to buy sweets, drinks and crisps. There is also limited glow items. The disco must be paid for on Parent Pay by 9.00am on Thursday 13th February. Tickets are available now on Parent Pay.

All children in Nursery and Reception children should be collected from their respective classroom doors at the end of the school day. KS1 children should be collected from the main playground, by an adult, at 4pm and KS2 children should also be collected on the main playground, by an adult, at 5.15pm.

KS2 children must be brought to school for the disco by an adult and the adult must wait for children to have gone through the double red doors before leaving then collecting them at 5.15pm. Parents/carers are responsible for KS2 children until they have entered the disco itself.

PARENT PAY BALANCES UP TO DATE

If you owe money for meals or trips (not including residentials), please settle outstanding balances **by the end of March** as we will be moving from Parent Pay over to Arbor.

Children also get to choose a book from our book vending machine.


Children can earn remarkable reader points by engaging in reading at home and in school. Who will win next week?
