UPCOMING SEND & WELLBEING COFFEE MORNINGS

We are delighted to invite you to our upcoming SEND and Wellbeing Coffee Mornings. These informal sessions are a chance to come together, enjoy a cup of tea or coffee, and explore practical strategies that can make a real difference at home.



Each session offers time to chat with our school SENDCo about the focus for the morning, as well as the opportunity to meet other parents who may be able to share their own experiences and what has helped their child. Many families tell us that these conversations are just as valuable as the session content itself.

SEND Coffee Morning - Thursday 22nd January 9-10am

This session will explore how to use visuals and social stories at home to support children with ASC and ADHD.

- Using visuals at home to help with routines, transitions, and independence
- Creating simple social stories to prepare children for new or tricky situations
- Strategies that support children with or without a diagnosis who may benefit from structure and predictability

These approaches can be helpful for any child who needs extra support with understanding, communication, or managing change.

Wellbeing Coffee Morning - Thursday 29th January 9-10am

This session will focus on how we use the Thrive approach in school to support big feelings, and how you can adapt these ideas at home.

- Understanding the Thrive approach and how it helps children feel safe, regulated, and ready to learn

- Practical strategies for supporting worry and anxiety
 - Ideas for responding to big emotions in ways that build connection and confidence
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- Both sessions are designed to be relaxed, welcoming, and genuinely useful. Whether you're looking for new ideas, reassurance, or simply a chance to talk things through with others who understand, we would love to see you there. APPOINTMENT REMINDER

We kindly request that non-urgent medical and dental appointments are arranged outside of school hours. Absences during the school day will only be authorised when proof of appointment is provided.

We also ask parents and carers to be mindful about collecting children early for their own personal appointments. We are noticing an increasing pattern of this which results in valuable learning time being lost and has a negative impact on the child's progress.

Establishing consistent routines is a priority for us and minimising disruption helps ensure every child benefits fully from their school day.

Y1 - Y6 CHESTER ZOO TRIP

- **Cost:** £10.75
- **Payment deadline:** Extended to 20th February (payment can be made in full or in instalments to suit your circumstances).



Important reminders:

- Children may wear their own clothes but must be dressed appropriately for the weather: lots of layers, warm footwear (no crocs), coats, gloves, hats and scarves.
- Unless entitled to free school meals and a packed lunch has already been requested from our catering team, please provide your child with a packed lunch and a drink.
- Children may bring money for the gift shop (maximum £10). Please note they are responsible for carrying their own money.
- Departure will be prompt – please ensure your child arrives to school on time by 8.40am
- We expect to return at approximately 3.30pm. Updates will be sent via Arbor upon departure.

UNIFORM & PE KIT REMINDERS

- **PE Kits:** School has provided PE kits and these are expected to be worn correctly. If children are not wearing the kit provided, calls will be made home.
- **Jewellery:** Only stud earrings are permitted. If hoops are worn, children will be asked to remove them if able. If not, parents/carers will need to come to school to swap them.
- **Other items:** Labubus, lip glosses and toys should not be brought into school and parents/carers will have to collect from the office if brought in.
