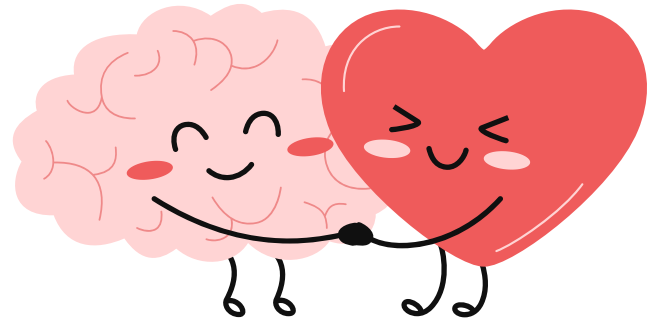

- Y3–Y6: 4:15–5:15pm

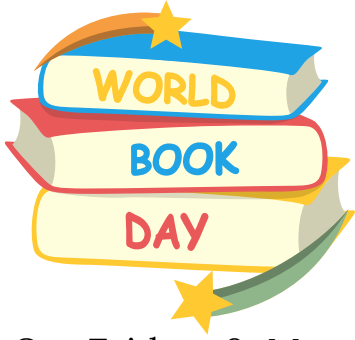

WORLD BOOK DAY - THURSDAY 5TH MARCH



World Book Day is on Thursday 5 March. Children are invited to come dressed as their favourite book character, wear their pyjamas, own clothes or stay in school uniform if they prefer.

Pupils will take part in a day of fun, cross-year activities and will have opportunities to mix with peers across the school.

On Friday 6 March, children in Reception–Y6 will enjoy Pinocchio workshops delivered by West End Musicals in Schools. Each class will work with a professional dancer to explore the timeless story through dance, with sessions tailored to each age group. At the end of the day, participating classes will come together to share their work in an abridged performance of the story, accompanied by original music and narration.

Working collaboratively, children will develop their physical literacy, creative expression, communication skills and gain a memorable performing experience.

THANK YOU INEOS

For the past four years, Roby Park has been proud to be part of the Forgotten Forty project led by INEOS. Through this incredible initiative, the company has provided £65,000 of funding, enabling us to bring to life projects that would simply not have been possible within the constraints of a school budget.

Their generosity has helped us to:

Sadly, due to rising costs, INEOS is no longer able to continue the Forgotten Forty project across the 99 schools it supports. While we are incredibly disappointed to see the project come to an end, we want to express our deepest thanks to INEOS for everything they have made possible for our school community. Their support has given our children opportunities we could only have dreamed of and the impact will be felt for many years to come.

FUNDED P.E. KITS

Due to the withdrawal of funding from INEOS, we will unfortunately no longer be able to provide free P.E. kits for all pupils. We know this has been a much-valued support for families so we wanted to give as much notice as possible that school P.E. kits will now need to be purchased by parents and carers.

We will continue to keep costs as low as possible by working with suppliers as well as operating pre-loved availability to help promote sustainability as well as supporting families.
