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ACTIVE UNIFORM

As you already know, our school is proudly Platinum OPAL accredited, recognising our commitment to high-quality outdoor play, creativity and active learning. As part of this ongoing work, we are excited about September.

Moving to an Active Uniform

From September, all pupils will move to an active uniform, which perfectly complements the OPAL approach and supports the rich outdoor experiences we provide every day. This change ensures children are comfortable, ready to move, and able to fully participate in the wide range of play and learning opportunities available to them.

Why an active uniform?

- Comfort and wellbeing — With fewer restrictive items, children can focus, feel confident and move freely throughout the day.
- Active learning and play — Pupils are always ready for PE, outdoor learning and OPAL play without needing to change clothes.
- Inclusion and equality — Particularly supportive for pupils with SEND, sensory needs or difficulties with fastenings. It is also more inclusive for girls, prioritising comfort, movement and choice so they can participate fully and confidently.
- Affordability and simplicity — Families only need one uniform instead of separate school and PE kits, with items that are easy to find and cost-effective.
- Independence — Younger pupils can manage dressing and toileting more easily, helping them build confidence and autonomy.
